

## Voices of September 11th

The Brooke Jackman Foundation shares this common belief—that we have a moral responsibility to support those affected by terrorism, and to advocate for reforms to hold those responsible accountable—

The bombing in Manchester, attacking children and their parents, was another visceral reminder of the unimaginable consequences of terrorism. The frequency of terrorist acts on innocent people going about their daily routines is unconscionable. As always, our thoughts and prayers are with those who suffered a loss of a loved one, and with the community who will be supporting them in their recovery.

As a family that has lost a loved one on 9/11 and in other attacks around the world that have occurred since, we understand firsthand the pain and suffering of these families. We also recognize the long journey they have ahead in rebuilding their lives and adapting to their new normal. Survivors understand the challenges in reconciling what they experienced in escaping, and responders recognize the difficulties in processing what they witnessed.

Please remember all those brave men and women who died in service to protect our country. We hope that you will also remember those innocent citizens from around the world who died in a war without borders — the victims of terrorism.

Everyone has dreams, and everyone deserves the chance to see their dreams come true. At BJF we try to instill self-confidence and enhance self-esteem in children – so they reach their full potential and make their dreams become a reality. But how do we level the playing field to give all children the tools they need to succeed? Literacy is the beginning.

Imagine that you are a child struggling with reading. What would school feel like? How will you learn when learning depends more and more on reading? What choices will be open to you? What choices will you make?

Nearly two-thirds of children in low-income schools read below grade level by the end of third grade. Most never catch up. We know they are four times more unlikely to graduate from high school.

We at the Brooke Jackman Foundation hope to empower children with a life-long love of reading. We hope that reading opens up a world of possibilities – knowledge, joy, hope and adventure through our family literacy programs, Brooke's Cooks program, BJF libraries and Brooke Packs.



For the past sixteen years, since its inception, BJF has believed that when you dream you should dream big, and then take the practical steps to make this dream a reality. We have turned countless dreams into realities through the important work we have engaged in, as highlighted in the following pages. We have made much progress in a short span of time, yet there is much more to be done.

On a personal note, our own family is expanding. As we go to print, we celebrate the birth of Erin and Ray's first child – Ryan Jack Farrell was born on July 5, 2017 – and are collecting children's books for his library. There is no greater joy than to share the love of reading with him.



#### #Giving Tuesday - Beautiful Tradition







#### Remembering Brooke...


imothy P. Oliver's book *Finding Fifteen* is about how his daily walk to the 9/11 Memorial became a journey of love, hope and survival. He honors the lives of fifteen innocent Americans caught up in the largest terrorist attack in the history of the United States. Chapter 3 is about

our Brooke. He starts the chapter with the Maya Angelou quotation, "My mission in life is not merely to survive but to thrive, and to do so with some passion, some compas-



sion, some humor and some style." The book's words capture Brooke's spirit, her compassion and passion for life. \* The new 9/11 Tribute Center will encourage people to do something good in honor

of lives lost that day, in response to the stories they can hear in the exhibits about the way people have given back in response to 9/11. The BJF is among the family foundations to be highlighted, including some quotations about our mission and what we have



supported an award to Todd Nussen from Oceanside High School. \* "How we honor my cousin's memory" is the title of Emily Kushner's beautiful article published in *Newsday*. Emily states that the events of September 11, 2001, changed America in many ways, and adds, "Unfortunately,




